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Road Safety Outside School

Please be aware of the need to be vigilant with all road users outside of school. Arrival and departure times have been staggered at school so we can keep social distancing between Bubbles. However, this has meant we have a longer period for vehicles to arrive and depart in. Coupled with the closure of the link road by the bridge, traffic volumes have increased. (The road works are due for completion soon so this may take away a lot of traffic going past the school). We have had one or two near misses on the road with pupils from WBS – parents and carers need to exercise caution at all times when using the road outside school. We are all glad to see the car park at Down-a-Gate used by so many parents and carers. There is ample room in this car park for dozens of vehicles and it should be used if you cannot park safely opposite school. Please remember that no parking is allowed on the double yellow lines and dropping off or picking up on the zig-zag lines is STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

Class Base Changes

We have now moved our Year 1/2 pupils' classroom to the front of school. The children should continue using the left hand entrance to school and will be let in to their cloakroom through the side door. All Year 3/4 pupils in Miss Stobbs and Mrs Douglass's class are now walking down the right-hand side of school, past the library and in through the side door to their classroom. Children in the EY class (Reception and Nursery) will continue walking up the left side of school to their classrooms. Mrs McBride is looking forward to having the two rooms for the expanding numbers in the Snowy Owls class.
