<u>Information Letters for Parents and Carers</u> – Public Health England have issued a guidance letter for parents and carers about 'Test and Trace'. This letter explains how you should check if you or a household member needs to have a Covid-19 test. It is available on the school website at:

<u>Test and Trace App</u> - The national NHS Test and Trace App is now available. The app is a key part of the country's fight against COVID-19. Cumbrians are being strongly encouraged to download the app to their smartphones now. The app is available on the Google Play Store and Apple App Store via https://www.covid19.nhs.uk. The app will be used, alongside traditional contact tracing, to notify users if they come into contact with someone who later tests positive for coronavirus.

Warwick Bridge school has been selected to take part in this year's Active Lives survey. Parents and children in Years 2, 4 and 6 will be asked to complete a survey about how you have kept yourselves fit and healthy over the course of the year. The Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) has issued the following statement about the survey:

"Your school's participation is important in helping us to understand how children engage with sport and physical activity, and the data we gather will play a key role in informing future policy and funding decisions. We are committed to ensuring that all children and young people, particularly those who are currently the least active or from under-represented groups, have the best opportunities to engage in sport and physical activity. Sport and physical activity have a unique power to bind people together, to help transform people's lives and to strengthen communities. A positive experience of sport and physical activity at a young age can help encourage a lifetime of participation." We hope that you can help by completing the survey and for every survey completed, the school receives a number of points that can be redeemed on sports equipment for school use.

Affordable Food Hub - Brampton

All parents and carers should be aware of the Support Help In Nourishing Everyone (SHINE) initiative. This brings an affordable food hub to Brampton which is available to everyone who may need a helping hand in feeding the family home. Since COVID 19 began, Brampton Area Action Group and SHINE have been working with County and City Councils and other organisations to

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ensure that those who are going through financial, physical or mental difficulties have access to food and support both during the crisis and into recovery. Partnering with Carlisle Community Help, Brampton Area Action Group are about to launch a new Affordable Food Initiative in Brampton to ensure that those who are struggling to put food on the table can have access to affordable food and to eliminate any stigma associated with asking for help.

The Scheme launched on Monday 21st September, with pick-ups at Brampton Community Centre on Tuesday and Friday afternoons.
