<sup>\*</sup>Cost will be capped at £10 per family and includes lunch. So a family with three children or more will pay no more than £10 per camp. Talkin Tarn Camps are limited to 8 children/young adults per 'bubble' with a total of 16 children/young adults.

Multisports Camps at William Howard are a maximum of 45 children per day in bubbles of 15.Due to the COVID 19 restrictions, places on each camp will be restricted to one camp per child, so that as many children have the opportunity to take part as possible. If there are spaces available on camps, then we will look (in discussion with the providers and in line with Government Guidelines) to allow children to partake in more than one camp to ensure all places are filled. Payment will be taken by the providers. Talkin Tarn requests card payment and Multisports requests payment be in cash.

## A message from SHINE - Affordable Food Hub in Brampton

We have also launched **Brampton's first Affordable Food Hub** in partnership with Carlisle Community Help for those families who are on benefits or finding it difficult to make ends meet in the current climate and need a little additional help and support in order to ensure they have good nutritious food available. So if you have families on low income, benefits, or know of people who have recently lost their jobs, then Brampton's Affordable Food Hub may be able to help reduce some of the financial burden.

#### **Coronavirus Measures**

All parents and carers of pupils at Warwick Bridge School should be aware that we are all prepared in case there is another national lockdown. We are building our Virtual Learning Platform where pupils will be able to look at lessons online. Staff will set work and see that it is marked accordingly. This will only come in to force if another lockdown is declared. We will keep you fully informed

## Click and Collect from Warwick Bridge Flour Mill

Here is a message from Warwick Bridge Flour Mill:

From Thursday 22nd October, we are offering a weekly click and collect service on flour and bakery products from the Mill. Just go to our online shop and place your orders before 3pm each Tuesday. Your order will be ready for you to pick up from the Mill on Thursdays between 10am and 2pm, near the water wheel. Collection of orders will be run in accordance with current Government COVID19 advice, and the following rules will be in place on the day:

- Only one person collecting allowed inside the mill at any one time.
- Customers must wear a face mask when collecting.
- Mill staff will wear appropriate PPE
- Hand sanitiser will be provided and must be used.

#### **Shoebox Appeal**

The annual shoebox appeal will go ahead once more this autumn. The 'Boxes of Hope' will be collected here at school before being taken to the collection point in Brampton. If you wish, you can take your shoebox to Sylvia Hall at 38 Irthing Park, Brampton, or you can telephone Katy Potter on 016977 42440 to arrange collection. There won't be a church service send-off however, due to the problems caused by the Covid-19 response. The boxes will then be sent to Kendal for checking before they are dispatched on their journey to Romania. Please have your boxes back in to school during the week 2<sup>nd</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> November. Remember that boxes need to be suitable for children of primary school age. **Please enclose £2 in an envelope inside your box to cover transport costs**.
