Year 6 Bubble

This week, we had to close our Year 6 Bubble due to a positive case of Covid-19. We have been able to identify the exact dates of this and working with Cumbria County Council Covid-19 Call Centre and Public Health England, the school has put all the correct protocols in to place. Certain members of our staff team were not in contact with the Year 6 Bubble in the days leading up to the case so they have been able to continue at work. The rest of the pupils and staff will be returning on Monday 14th December and we will be very happy to see them in school for the last week of term. Please read the information below if you have any queries about what to do when a member of your household develops Covid-19 symptoms.

Reminders about Covid-19 - When a member of your household develops symptoms of COVID-19:

When an adult or child develops one or more symptoms of COVID-19 (a new continuous cough, high temperature or loss of/change to their sense of taste and smell), they need to get tested as soon as possible and the whole household needs to isolate at home immediately.

- If the test result comes back NEGATIVE, the household can end their isolation (i.e. leave the house and return to normal including attending work and school) as long as:
 - The individual with symptoms has not had a high temperature for 48 hours
 - No-one else in the household has symptoms (if this is the case they also need to get tested and the household isolate until the result is known)
 - Members of the household have not been told they need to self-isolate because they are a close-contact of a positive case from outside the household
- If the test comes back POSITIVE, the household should continue to isolate. The household should isolate for 14 days from the date that the person who has tested positive developed symptoms (or if they didn't have symptoms, the date they had their test)

Department of Education Announcement – end of term, Friday 18th December

Mid-afternoon on Tuesday, the Department for Education released information to schools suggesting that it would be possible to move INSET days scheduled for January or later to the 18th December. This was touted as being a generous offer to teachers and families – reducing the risk to groups or individuals. This information is now being shared in the press and on social media. After discussions with staff and our Governing Board, Warwick Bridge Primary School is continuing with the existing holiday arrangements. A single day will make no difference if a class or classes are isolated before this point, nor does it help families who have already arranged childcare from Monday 21st December. Cumbrian schools do not have the option of moving an INSET day easily either, for these days are set countywide to minimise inconvenience to parents. The most effective thing that we can all do is to follow the instructions and guidance on keeping safe. This means washing hands, avoiding unnecessary contact with others and booking a test if you or your children experience any symptoms. School will still finish on Friday 18th December at our normal time.

School Dinners

After looking at the provision for school dinners for the coming months and the results of the recent survey. We have had to increase the daily charge to £2.62 per meal. This will be reflected in the amounts you are paying on the school Lunchshop system. This change will take effect in January 2021.
