Miss Day's Baby

We are very pleased to announce that Miss Day gave birth to her daughter during the half-term break. Baby Chloe weighed in at 5lb 6oz. Miss Day and her daughter are now home and doing very well indeed. We hope to have a visit from them both in the coming weeks. Staff Changes

There are a number of staffing changes to make everyone aware of. With the imminent return of all pupils to school in ten days' time, these will take full effect from Monday 8th March.

Snowy Owls (Nursery and Reception)

For the next few weeks Mrs McBride will be in school to work with small groups and individuals from the Snowy Owls Class as she prepares to go on her maternity leave. The day to day running of the Early Years class will be taken over by Mrs Douglass and Mrs Holliday. They will both look after the daily work of all EY children and staff. Mrs Holliday will be in school on Mondays and Tuesdays whilst Mrs Douglass will lead for the remainder of the week. Both teachers have a vast amount of knowledge in leading the Early Years classroom and they are both looking forward to working with all the children. Miss Marshall will also be working with the pupils as she continues her placement at Warwick Bridge School.

Polar Bears (Years 1 and 2)

Miss Hogarth continues to lead the Y1/2 class and she will be joined by Mrs Simpson who will be continuing her placement at school. The children, parents and carers of the Y1/2 class will be familiar with Mrs Simpson as she has been leading Zoom sessions online during this most recent period of lockdown. The class will also be joined each week by Miss Ryan who will take small groups during the week and then work as the class lead on every second Friday. We look forward to welcoming Miss Ryan in to school in the week that we all return to full-time education at school.

Arctic Foxes (Years 3 and 4)

As Mrs Douglass will be working from Wednesday to Friday in the EY class, Miss James will now become the class lead for those three days with the Arctic Foxes. Miss James has been working with the class all year and will continue her role as class support on Monday and Tuesday when Mrs Kelly will be working with the pupils. Mrs Tyrrell will also continue her work with the class on a daily basis

Arctic Wolves (Years 4 and 5)

Since Miss Day has been on maternity leave, Miss Stobbs has become the full-time class teacher with the Year 4/5 Arctic Wolves Class. This will continue for the rest of the spring and summer terms.

Staff changes in any class will bring a new individual to some of the pupils. We know that the staff at Warwick Bridge School have great experience in working with children of all ages in a Primary School setting, so we are sure that the pupils will become used to these changes and work well with the new class lead in all cases. We are all looking forward to seeing all staff and children back in school in the coming weeks and know that they will continue to work together for the good of the whole Warwick Bridge community.

Return to School - March 8th 2021

This week the government announced that there will be a full return of all pupils to school from Monday March 8th. This date is now just over a week away. WBS will follow government guidelines in all respects and open the school safely for all pupils and staff. The health and safety of everyone at Warwick Bridge School is paramount at all times, so the school will ensure that social distancing as far as is practicable will be carried out for all concerned. We will encourage hand-washing and the use of alcohol gel to maintain cleanliness. Staff and pupils will use disinfected wipes to ensure all surfaces and handles are clean. Risk Assessments

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that were put in place from the start of school in September 2020 will be reviewed and followed throughout school. If you have any concerns about the return to school from March 8th please do not hesitate to get in touch and we can hopefully allay any fears or apprehensions you or your child may have. A separate letter about the return to school will be sent out on Monday 1st March.

Vaccinations Update - news from NHS North Cumbria

Some key points to note:

- People in cohorts 5 and 6 are being invited by the NHS to have their vaccine
- People in Cohort 5 may also receive a letter from the National Booking Service, providing an alternative option which
 invites them to book at a Large Vaccination Centre. However as you would need to travel further for your vaccination it
 might be more convenient for people to wait for their local vaccination service run by their GPs to get in touch.
 Everyone in the priority cohorts who wants to have a vaccination can do so from their local GP vaccination service.
- If you are over 70 years old and have still not been contacted (or refused but have since changed your mind) please
 now contact your surgery so they can advise you on when you can expect an appointment.
 Our website has also been updated with Covid-19 Vaccine leaflets in alternative languages and accessible formats.

Lots of other information and resources are available at: www.northcumbriaccg.nhs.uk/covid. Cohort 5 - all those 65 years of age and over

- Cohort 6 all individuals aged 16 years to 64 years with underlying health conditions which put them at higher risk of serious disease and mortality
- Unpaid carers, including those in receipt of carers allowance, are also part of cohort 6 and are part of Primary Care's roll out. The NHS will be working with relevant partner organisations to ensure that the vaccine is delivered to unpaid carers as part of the cohort.
- · Local GP vaccination services will be calling in both cohorts.

Please note that 'local GP vaccination services' are your GPs working together in local areas as part of Primary Care Networks (PCNs). We have eight of these networks across north Cumbria who are delivering the vaccine from nine hubs.

People in Cohort 5 may also receive a letter from the **National Booking Service**, providing an **alternative option** which invites them to book at a Large Vaccination Centre. However as **you would need to travel further for your vaccination it might be more convenient for people to wait for their local vaccination service, run by their own GPs, to get in touch. Everyone in the priority cohorts who want to have a vaccination can do so from their local GP vaccination service.**

The nearest Large Vaccination Centres at the moment are located in Kendal, Ulverston and Lancaster. There are also sites in the North East at Newcastle's Centre for Life and the NHS Nightingale Hospital North East, Sunderland with a third Large Vaccination Centre location opening in Durham opening soon. If you want to wait to be called by your local GP vaccination service then please do not respond to the national booking service invitation.

The way the cohorts are being invited may result in a younger person with an underlying health condition being offered an appointment before someone in the over 65 year age group. This doesn't mean you have been missed so please wait until the NHS contacts you.

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In the meantime the message remains the same - the NHS will be in contact with you when the time is right for you to be invited for your vaccine. Please do not contact the NHS, please wait for the NHS to contact you.

- Papyrus UK Charity for the prevention of young suicide hopefully they can provide support for parents in dealing with the young person's self-harming and suicidal behaviour and ways.
