The Big Ask – a survey to be completed at home and school

The new Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, has today launched The Big Ask – the largest ever consultation with children aged 4 to 17 in England. It aims to find out children's concerns and aspirations about the future, so that we can put children at the heart of our country's recovery from the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. All schools are encouraged to support their pupils to complete this survey. Parents, carers and those working with children are also invited to complete the adult survey, to share their views about the future for children and young people today, and what they think is holding young people back.
