Cumbria Libraries will be encouraging children to take part in the Summer Reading Challenge again this year and the theme is Wild World Heroes, celebrating reading, nature and action for the environment. This annual national event, which this year begins on 10 July, encourages children aged 4 to 11 to set themselves a reading challenge to help prevent the summer reading “dip”. Cumbria Libraries will support and motivate thousands of children to keep reading to build their skills and confidence. Signing up is free, you just need to be a library member, which is also free! The challenge is simple; children read whatever they like in their chosen format over the summer holidays to receive incentives and a certificate once they’ve completed it. They can read fiction, fact books, poetry, joke books, picture books or graphic novels. WBS - Working, Believing, Succeeding – A Wonderful Bridge to Success

Who is it for?

- There are 200 activities on offer from nearly 60 organisations.
- All are free of charge for children and young people who receive benefits-related Free School Meals.
- More than half the activities also have paid-for places available to any child.
- Around a third have additional free places available for children in particular circumstances. Eligibility depends on the organisation running the activity.
- Places are limited and bookings will work on a first-come-first served basis.
- The activities have been designed to be as inclusive as possible and some activities are specifically for children and young people with additional support needs (key word search 'needs'). Please check the details of each activity and contact the provider if your child has particular requirements.

- If transport to Multisports from Brampton is required please confirm so we can book it accordingly
- Additional funding has been secured from the Brampton League of Friends to help expand the programme and subsidise those children/families who do not come under the Holiday and Food (HAF) funding criteria
- For those paying for sessions/activities, they must pay directly to the provider on the day of the activity. Costs for those children not on free school meals are as follows;
- Golf Taster Sessions: £5 per session
- Multisports: £25 per Three Day Camp
- Talking Adventures: £25 per Three Day Camp or £10 per One Day Camp
- GLL Outdoor Rural Fun Days: £8 per One Day Camp
- Fellfoot Forward Outdoor Fun Sessions: Free
