Reindeer Run for Jigsaw Children's Hospice

WBS is proud to support the fundraising campaign by Jigsaw Children's Hospice in Carlisle. All our children are able to take part in this. They will be invited to wear festive reindeer antlers and run a short distance at school. We have received the following message from Vicki Lesley, the fundraiser at Jigsaw: Jigsaw is a place of fun and laughter where children and young adults can stay and create memories which will last a lifetime. We provide one to one care for children and young adults with life limiting illnesses, with the facility for up to five children and young adults for day support, with 2 able to stay for overnight and respite care. Our home from home environment allows the nurses to match the children and young adults home routines as closely as possible, ensuring a smooth, relaxing and peaceful transition between home and hospice environments. The children will each receive a sponsor form but we understand that you may prefer not to deal with cash, so we have created an online donation page specifically for our Reindeer Run!
