We have received the following message from Claire Crisp who is the Fostering Communications and Engagement Officer for Cumbria. If you know anyone else who may be interested in fostering, please pass on the information.

We have an urgent need to recruit more foster carers for vulnerable children across the county. There are events held throughout the county to recruit more people into the field of fostering. Our events are scheduled on the following dates:

Friday 4 March - Fostering drop in at the round House Hub and Café, Walney from 12pm to 2pm

Friday 11 March - Carlisle fostering drop in at Costa Coffee in The Lanes Shopping Centre - from 12pm to 2pm

Tuesday 22 March - Fostering drop in at Costa Coffee in Steelman's Walk, Workington - from 12pm to 2pm

Thursday 31 March - Fostering drop-in at Costa Coffee in Hindpool Retail Park, Barrow (next to Subway) from 12 to 2pm

School Clothing and Attire

Please can all parents and carers ensure that children are wearing the correct clothing for all school activities. This means that all footwear should be suitable school shoes and not trainers. PE kits must have the regulation sky-blue WBS t-shirt with a school sweatshirt and plain, dark shorts/tracksuit bottoms. Hair accessories should be small, discreet and navy blue. We also want to remind you that jewellery is limited to stud earrings that can be removed for PE (or taped up). No hooped earrings at all and no rings are allowed in school.

Toys in School

Parents and carers are reminded that children should not be bringing any toys in to school with them. If a child has a toy, please take it off them before they enter school. A small number of pupils are bringing toys in to school, including different types of collecting cards, and this is not allowed. Sometimes these items are lost, damaged, lent and borrowed and this can cause a number of problems for staff. Thank you for your cooperation in this.

Latest Covid Advice from HM Government

Self-isolation

From 24 February, the Government will remove the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. In addition, the Government will no longer ask fully vaccinated close contacts and those aged under 18 to test daily for 7 days and routine contact tracing will end. Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days. School staff, children and young people who are contacts should attend their education settings as usual. This includes staff who have been in close contact within their household, unless they are able to work from home.

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) published [updated guidance](#) on 24 February.

Should parents send their child to school if they think they have COVID-19?

If a child has any of the main symptoms or a positive test result, the public health advice remains unchanged and is to stay at home and avoid contact with other people. Anyone with any of the main COVID-19 symptoms should order a test and is advised to stay at home while waiting for the result. If they test positive, they are advised to follow public health advice.
