KS1 Special Journeys: Unit Overview

Why Do People Go On Special Journeys and Pilgrimages?

Introduction

This Unit allows learners to explore the idea of special journeys and religious pilgrimages. They will discover why people from different religions and worldviews choose to go on these journeys, what they experience and what these journeys mean to them.

- Lesson 3 Outdoor Opportunity For this opportunity, the class will visit a local church to deepen their understanding of Christian pilgrimages. You will need to carry out the necessary risk assessments and arrange for any additional staff support ahead of the visit.
- Lesson 3 Creative Opportunity For this creative task, pupils will design and make their own stained glass windows using cellophane, coloured paper and scissors.
- Lesson 5 Creative Opportunity Pupils will use materials such as clay, cardboard or building blocks to construct a model of a significant landmark.

Progression Statements

- Understand that a pilgrimage is a journey made to a special place for religious reasons.
- Recognise that people travel on pilgrimages to show devotion and seek spiritual growth.
- Learn about specific pilgrimage sites such as the Ka'bah in Mecca, the Western Wall in Jerusalem and the Ganges river in Varanasi.
- Understand why these sites are considered sacred and significant to believers.
- Explore simple stories and legends associated with pilgrimage sites.



Prior Learning

Previously in KS1, during the Belonging Unit, children learnt about what it means to be part of different communities. In the Sacred Places in Judaism Unit, they were introduced to the concept of pilgrimage and discovered that Jewish people often visit the Western Wall. You can find the progression of learning with statements on the <u>Progression Map</u>.

Digging Deeper

Each lesson in this Unit will support learners in developing a deeper understanding of pilgrimages and why people from various faiths and worldviews choose to go on them. By the time pupils encounter the LKS2 Pilgrimages Unit, they will have a solid understanding of why Christians may choose to undertake a pilgrimage. Together, these units will build a strong foundation for the UKS2 Islamic Pilgrimage Unit, where children will explore the rituals and historical background associated with Islamic pilgrimages.







Lesson Breakdown	
Lesson 1: What Is a Special Journey? In this lesson, children will think about what makes some journeys more special than others. They will also be introduced to the idea of pilgrimages. Lesson 2: What Is Hajj and Why Is It a Special Journey for Muslims? Pupils will review the Five Pillars of Islam, with a focus on the fifth pillar which is Hajj. Lesson 3: Why Do Christians Go on Special Journeys? This lesson explores why Christians may choose to go on special journeys. Pupils will learn about Canterbury Cathedral in Kent and understand why it is a place of pilgrimage for many Christians. Lesson 4: Why Do Jewish People Go on Special Journeys? In this lesson, pupils will explore the significance of the Western Wall in Jerusalem for Jewish people.
