Prior Learning

Previously in KS1, children have learnt about <u>Christianity in Art</u>, <u>Jewish Stories</u> and <u>Churches and Cathedrals</u>. They have learnt how people show their beliefs through places, stories and symbols. In this Unit, they will build on their learning by considering how different faiths celebrate the birth of a baby as a special new beginning.

Digging Deeper

Each lesson in this Unit will help your learners understand why new beginnings are special. They will explore how different religions celebrate new life and what these traditions can mean to people of faith. This Unit lays a strong foundation for learning about key life events and their significance in various faiths and worldviews. Progression Statements

- Identify common celebrations such as birthdays.
- Recognise that celebrations are special occasions where people come together to mark important events and are times for joy, sharing and being with loved ones.
- Understand the significance of these celebrations and how they are celebrated by different religious and non-religious communities.
- Recognise symbols, rituals and traditions associated with religious celebrations.
- Learn about common rites of passage such as birthdays, christenings and weddings.
- Tell their peers about any christenings or weddings they have attended.
- Explain what a ceremony and ritual is.

- Begin to discuss the meaning of ceremonies and rituals, including expressing their own experiences of them.
- Observe when practices and rituals are similar to or the same as practices and rituals in other religions and worldviews.
- Ask questions about their own and others' feelings and experiences.
