You can also leave a message on the school answerphone and this is monitored daily. If you are having problems printing materials let your class teacher know. The vast majority of work, however, does not need printing out at all. Children can work from the screen and write the answers to work on a lined or plain piece of paper. If you are unable to print any work please contact your class teacher and we can arrange work to be collected from school. Don't forget that you can upload work onto Class Dojo for the teachers to see.
